Department Information

We are looking to appoint an inspirational individual who will sustain and develop the strong reputation of the Art Department at Waddesdon.

This very well-resourced department, born out of the legacy of the school's previous Visual Arts Specialist Status, allows students to develop knowledge, skills and understanding from a broad range of subject choices including Art, Craft and Design, Graphic Communication and Photography. Students at GCSE follow a three-year curriculum starting in Year 9 which builds upon a comprehensive introduction to our Art and Design mastery programme taught at Key Stage 3. Significant numbers of students opt for our range of subjects at GCSE and A Level so that typically, we have six groups opting for GCSE Art, Graphics and Photography each year and around 100 students following courses in Years 12 and 13.

The department comprises five purpose-built studios, including three iMac suites, with industry-leading software such as Adobe Creative Suite, and three open-beamed and north light-facing studios. With the facilities and excellent equipment that we have, we are able to support most art disciplines, including clay, printmaking, painting and drawing and new media. We also have a multi-purpose room that acts as a photographic studio, used mainly for Sixth Formers, with various lighting, backdrops and black-out, and SLR cameras. Students print their photographic and graphic outcomes digitally in the department and this work is regularly displayed.

The team consists of five teachers and a technician, including the subject leader supported by an experienced second in department. The team work well together and are very experienced and highly professional. There is a culture of collaboration and a desire to develop new ideas and share good practice, in order to build on successes and student progress. In recent years, we have also worked with trainee teachers.

Outside of Covid times, students spend a significant amount of their spare time working in the Art Department, be it at lunchtime, attending the Art Zone which is run four nights a week, and for Sixth Formers many "live" in the studios in their study periods. All year groups are involved in school visits to galleries, exhibitions and other cultural destinations. These vary from local visits to visits to London and additionally, for Sixth Formers, to galleries in Europe.

Currently the department follows OCR for GCSE, AS and A Level for Art, Craft and Design, Photography and Graphic Communication. This enables us to provide a diverse creative curriculum choice and fits very much with our vision of a broad artistic curriculum. 2019 exam results at GCSE were outstanding, with the average grade being a 6 in Art, a 7 in Graphics and a 7 in Photography. 91% achieved FFT20 targets in Art, 94% in Graphics and 97% in Photography. There was no real gap in the performance between boys and girls. Also, Disadvantaged students performed in line with their peers and all other subgroups performed at or above expectations. At A Level ALPS scores were 3 in Art and Graphics and 4 in Photography. In September 2019, many students went on to university to pursue a broad range of Art and Design courses. We regularly have a good number following Art and Design as a career choice.

In partnership with the Technology and Media Studies Departments, we have an annual exhibition each year that fills the department and our gallery corridor with student work. This is a key event in the school calendar, attended by many year groups and staff during the day and parents and relatives at the private view in the evening. We also have rolling exhibitions through the year in the gallery corridor and the studios. These are done completely by the students who have become well versed in displaying their own work as well as valuing and improving their own exhibitions.
