

As you will be aware, Ofqual released information yesterday following their consultation about how GCSE, A level and Vocational (BTEC and Applied) qualifications will be determined this summer.

Details are very much emerging and there are still a number of unknowns. What we do know is that students will need to have completed all assessments by May half term to enable us to meet the exam board deadline for submission of final grades by 18th June. In order to ensure we do our best for the students, we now need time to put considerable planning and training in place. We are also working with other schools to ensure parity, where possible, across the County. We will write to you again by March 26th with further details of the programme of summer internal assessment.

In the meantime, students should continue to complete assessed work as best they can. The rescheduled Year 13 mocks will give students invaluable practice ahead of the summer assessments, as well as very importantly, enough to time to improve based on teacher feedback, as Year 11 had before Christmas. Both Year 11 and 13 students will be given plenty of opportunities through ongoing assessment in class to show what they can do and teacher feedback will help them improve prior to final summer assessments.

We do not underestimate the pressure students may feel under in the coming months, but teachers understand that students can have 'blip' assessment results and also know the significant progress many students can make over the last couple of months.
