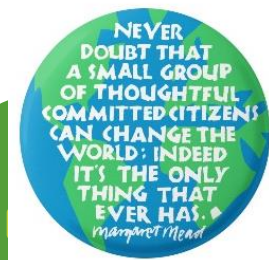

### Charity Week (16<sup>th</sup> – 20<sup>th</sup> October)

Our Sixth Form Student Leadership Team are doing some amazing work tackling issues that they care about.



In the week of 16<sup>th</sup> October, they will be encouraging our student body to reflect on what charity means and how we can live out our shared values by helping others.

On Friday, 20<sup>th</sup> October, students will be raising awareness, and money, for Breast Cancer by holding a non-uniform day.

## Supporting independent learning – Period 6



We know that independent learning matters and as a school value the place of meaningful homework and structured revision. For example, you can't become proficient in French or Spanish without regularly learning vocabulary and reviewing grammar at home.

Students who fail to complete three or more homework tasks over a two-week period are entered into our Period 6 after-school support sessions (in the first instance for four sessions, increasing in number for students who continue to struggle meeting homework deadlines). We ask that parents support their children by supporting us, if your child is unable to complete work at home.

We also run a voluntary afterschool homework club Monday to Thursday which all students are welcome to attend.

Homework is seen as one of the principal ways in which student achievement can be raised and it is important that homework is valued, so that it becomes routine. We believe the responsibility for completing homework in the first instance comes from the students themselves, alongside parents who may help provide structure and routine.



### Preparing for Exams

This term, we are supporting our students with examination practice in Year 13, Year 10 and Year 11, with key dates being:

w.b. 2<sup>nd</sup> October: Year 13 Snapshot Assessment Week

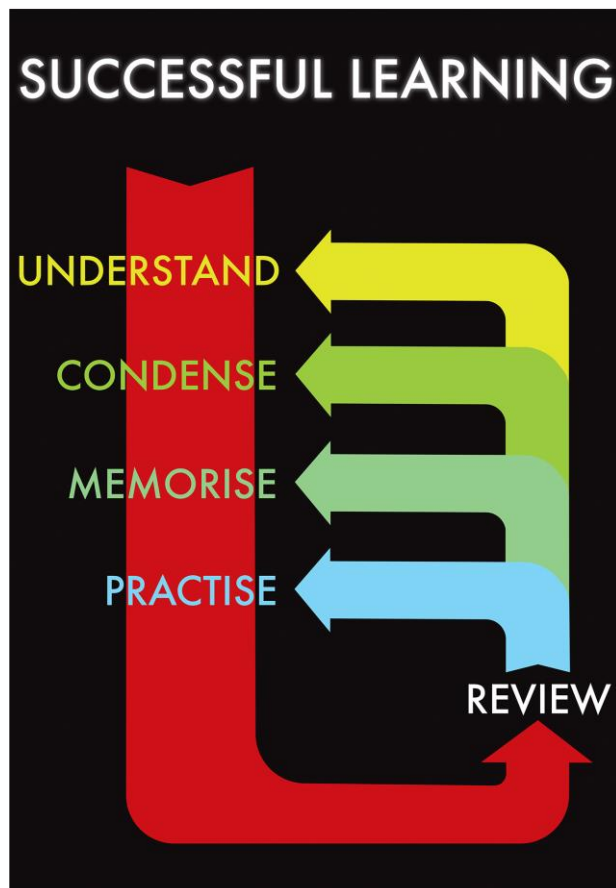
w.b. 30<sup>th</sup> October: Year 10 Mock Exam Week

w.b. 4<sup>th</sup> December: Year 11 Mock Exam Fortnight

Based on knowledge of long-term retrieval and our experience of what makes the most difference, we encourage our students to consider five steps in their independent practice: understand, condense, memorise, practise and review.

There is a Year 11 Parents' Information Evening on 1<sup>st</sup> November to provide support and strategies to maximise revision and preparation.

CGP revision guides are available to purchase on ParentPay to help your son / daughter revise for their upcoming English Literature and English Language mock exams. The relevant books for English Literature are the Power and Conflict guide and workbook.





## Attendance Matters

Thank you for your continued support on ensuring the highest attendance at school possible.

## What to do if you have symptoms of COVID-19

The NHS advises that people "stay at home and avoid contact with other people if you or your child have symptoms and either:

- have a high temperature (*38C or above*)
- do not feel well enough to go to work, school, childcare, or do your normal activities

You can go back to your normal activities when you feel better or do not have a high temperature. If your child has mild symptoms such as a runny nose, sore throat or mild cough, and they feel well enough, they can go to school or childcare."

"You are no longer required to do a COVID-19 rapid lateral flow test if you have symptoms. But if you or your child have tested positive for COVID-19:

- try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 3 days after the day the test was taken if you or your child are under 18 years old – children and young people tend to be infectious to other people for less time than adults
- try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 5 days after the day you took your test if you are 18 years old or over."



## Update on the Work in School

Our Business Manager and Site Staff continue to work to improve the accommodation following the closure of our restaurant.

The marquee is working well for lunch and break times, providing an effective eating and socialising space for our students. Over the course of the next week, it will be fitted with heating and the side panels reinforced so that we can continue to use it as the weather becomes more autumnal.



We are working with the Department for Education on two additional projects: firstly, we will construct a separate study space for our Sixth Form (similar to the picture you see here); secondly, it is likely that we will completely replace the restaurant roof and re-model the interior. Although this is a longer project, it will provide better facilities in the longer term for our young people. We'll keep you informed and up-to-date as things develop.

We are a Microsoft school and as such we administer our own Tenancy. What this means for you and your child, is that you can download and use Microsoft Office applications (e.g. Word, Excell and PowerPoint) for free on five devices while your child is a student at this school.

To access this facility all you have to do is open a web browser on your computer and go to [www.office.com](http://www.office.com) and click the Sign in button. Sign into Office 365 using the email address and password issued to the student when they started at Waddesdon. Once you have logged in, click the Install Apps button at the top right. Please note that this facility is only available while your child is a student at the school, and you are limited to five devices. Unfortunately we are unable to offer support if you have any issues installing the applications on your private machines.



## The Waddesdon Greenway

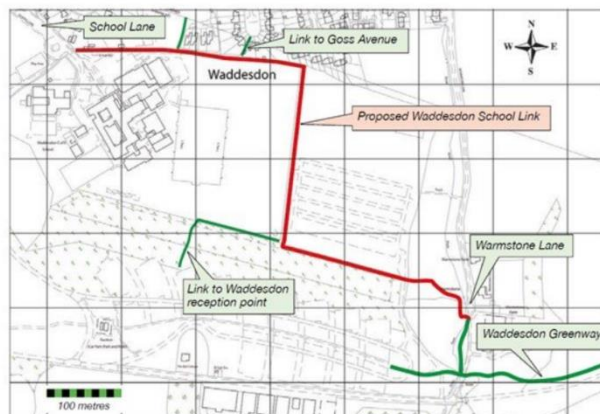
Construction work to upgrade an 800m path between the existing [Waddesdon Greenway](#) and Waddesdon schools is well under way.

The project is due for completion in October 2023.

We would love to be able to install additional bike racks due to increased demand.

## Wednesday Late Bus

The late bus is now up and running! We encourage our students to take advantage of it so that they can take part in extra-curricular activities (see [website.](#)) and also if they need to catch up on, or complete work.

The routes are outlined below:

**Route 1:** Westcott, Ashendon, Upper Winchendon, Quainton (The Green), Pitchcott, Oving (Bowling Alley), North Marston (Pilgrim PH), Whitchurch (on request), Hardwick (on request)



**Route 2:** Kingswood, Grendon Underwood (all stops if required), Springhill (prison), Edgcott, Calvert (Green), Charndon (on request), Marsh Gibbon The Plough (on request), Ludgershall Village Hall (on request)

The buses will return to their depots in Aylesbury and so the bus company (Motts) have also indicated that they would be happy to drop students to a central point in Aylesbury, if required.

Both buses will leave school at 4.35pm, with the longest journey time taking approximately 45 minutes.

Even in moments of high emotion, we ask that you consider how best to convey your complaint. If the issue cannot be resolved by email or a phone conversation, then it is usually best to arrange a face-to-face meeting as lengthy email exchanges tend to become counter-productive.
